## How long will it take to obtain ethics clearance?



LOW RISK: Low-risk applications are reviewed by the Faculty Ethics Screening Committee (FESC), and it takes approximately 4 weeks to get from Point # 1 to Point # 8 below (refer to the next slide). Once Point # 8 has been reached, an applicant will receive a formal "go-ahead-with-your-data-collection" email from the FESC. It is important to note, though, that the Research Ethics Committee (REC) still has the prerogative to add a few additional stipulations, or to request further clarification/changes (which the applicant needs to respond to asap), before final approval is granted. Once an applicant has received the go-ahead from the FESC to start with their data collection, it takes an additional 40 days for the applicant to receive a formal letter of ethics clearance from the REC.

<u>MEDIUM/HIGH RISK</u>: Medium-risk or high-risk applications are reviewed by the Research Ethics Committee (REC), and it takes approximately 6 - 10 weeks to get from Point # 8 to Point # 10 (refer to the next slide). When it comes to medium-risk or high-risk applications, Point # 2 to Point # 8 becomes irrelevant, seeing as the application is reviewed by the REC, and not by the FESC. The FESC receives the application, though, and does a quick evaluation to ascertain whether the application is indeed medium-risk. Once the level of risk has been determined (usually within 7 days), the FESC submits the application to the REC for review and changes requested. An applicant will therefore need to wait until the REC gives the go-ahead before they can start with their data collection.

<u>INSTITUTIONAL PERMISSION</u>: Institutional permission (which is a completely separate process) might also be required. If the applicant applies for <u>institutional permission from Stellenbosch University</u>, it takes approximately 2 - 6 weeks for the application to be processed. If an applicant applies for institutional permission from an outside institution, the duration will depend on the institution.
